2006 Highlights

This year represented one of transition for CCFC as it developed and implemented plans to move the organization to the next level. It has revamped its vision and mission statements, revised its logo, and convened new committees. It is in the process of redesigning its website and developing new training programs.

- ▶ Recruited, trained, and helped credential 122 faith-based and non-traditional recovery support providers throughout the state. Recovery support providers are reimbursed by the Missouri Division of Alcohol and Drug Abuse for providing support services to people with substance abuse problems. Our goal was to recruit 100.
- ▶ To date, more than 600 participants from throughout Missouri have completed CCFC's Basic Addictions Academy, including one participant from Virginia. Two basic academies were held in 2006.
- ▶ 49 people completed CCFC's first Advanced Addictions Academy that was piloted at Lincoln University July 31-August 2, 2006. One of the participants was from Arkansas.
- ▶ More than 300 people attended workshops in CCFC's well-received faith-based track of the Missouri Department of Mental Health's annual Spring Training Institute May 17-19, 2006 in the Lake of the Ozarks. CCFC has been invited to coordinate the 2007 faith-based track.
- ▶ Hosted series of four two-day capacity building workshops and series of four two-day sustainability workshops for the faith community in St. Louis, Kansas City, Sikeston, and Columbia. The workshops received rave reviews. 64 attended the sustainability workshops and 52 attended the capacity building.
- ▶ Hosted regional meetings with faith-based providers involved with Access to Recovery in Springfield, Moberly, St. Louis, Kansas City, and Kennett.
- ▶ Convened statewide meetings of the Missouri Faith Community Substance Abuse Resource Network and increased the number of participants from central Missouri.
